\*Direct Assistance includes 42 home elevations, 198 lifts/elevators, 29 ramps, 5 TRAC LALift Home sponsorships, 42 flood insurance premium grants, medicine, gas cards, school uniforms, food, utility payments, rent and mortgage payments, furniture, roof repairs, home repairs. No regular CCHT staff salaries were charged to disaster, though all staff responded. Caseworker costs are for new staff hired or contracted specifically for disaster relief.

Note: This report covers hurricanes Katrina, Rita, Gustav and Ike, Isaac, the 2009 Alidore floods, the 2010 Oil Spill and the 2011 Spring Flood preparations. This report does not include the 1,373 families helped by the Good Samaritan Food Banks after hurricanes, nor the 400 families assisted by CCHT staff with disaster emergency food stamp applications after Katrina. Nor does this include spending by individual Catholic parishes, Operation Starfish, St. Vincent de Paul Society and Knights of Columbus Councils.
